Supportive services for each program can include case management, recovery support and/or peer support as well as access to outpatient counseling and medication management.

Group living with supportive services for male Veterans experiencing homelessness and problems with mental illness or co-occurring disorders. Veterans must be approved to reside in the program by VA Nebraska-Western Iowa Health Care Systems. Expected stay is 6 months.

CenterPointe is a Region V provider. We can provide services on a sliding-fee scale for income-qualified people. We also accept Medicaid, Medicare and private insurance. 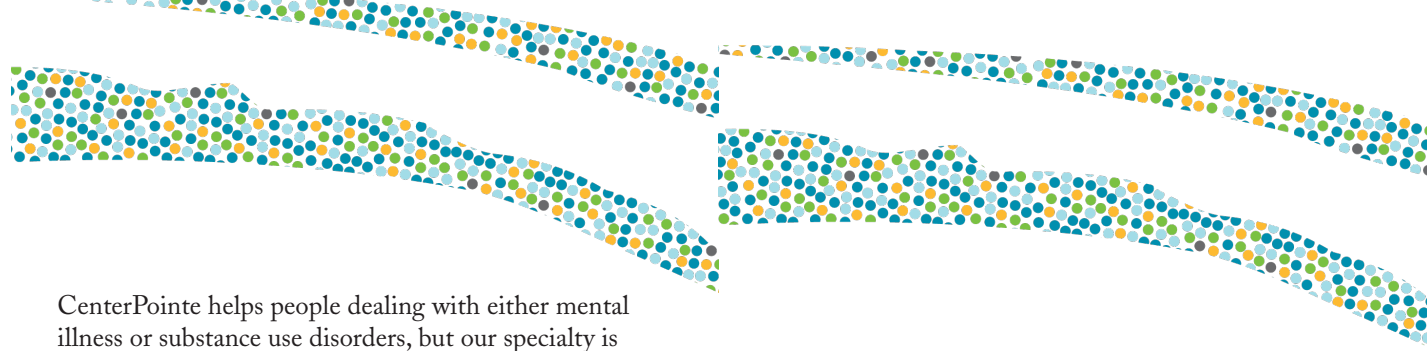

Adult Residential	Adult Residential Case Manager	402.475.8748	Transitional housing and residential treatment for homeless adults with severe and persistent mental illness and substance dependence. Includes individual, group and family counseling, recreational therapy, case management and psychiatric services. Expected stay is 6-8 months.
Touchstone	Admission Coordinator	402.474.4343	Short-term residential services for adults experiencing problems with substance use. Services include individual, group and family counseling, case management and psychiatric services. Provided in collaboration with Houses of Hope. Expected stay is 45 days.
Outpatient	Outpatient Program Director	402.475.5161 x336	Outpatient treatment for adults experiencing problems with mental illness, substance use, or co-occurring disorders. May include individual, group and family counseling, and psychiatric services.
PIER	PIER Program Director	402.435.4044 x209	Assertive Community Treatment - delivering a full range of services to people diagnosed with a severe and persistent mental illness such as schizophrenia, schizoaffective disorder, or bipolar disorder. Services are provided in the participant's home or other community setting. Provided in collaboration with Lutheran Family Services.
MidPointe	Director of Day Rehabilitation	402.261.6065 x511	Long-term, structured day services for adults with severe and persistent mental illness or co-occurring disorders. Services develop daily living skills designed to reduce admissions to more intensive services. Enrollment may last up to 5 years.
Community Transitions	Program Director	402.904.4081	Psychiatric Residential Rehabilitation program provides recovery and rehabilitation services within a residential setting to prepare adults with serious mental illness for community living.
Artists on the Edge/Writer's Workshop	Peer Support Team Lead	402.475.5161 x352	A community-wide program for individuals to express creative talent through writing or visual arts. Provided in collaboration with Lincoln Parks and Recreation. Program meets at F Street Recreation Center.
Community Support	Outreach Team Lead	402.475.5161 x337	Individual support and advocacy for adults experiencing problems with mental illness, substance use, or co-occurring disorders. Services are provided in the participant's home or other community settings to access community resources, to develop skills needed to reside in the community, and to prevent exacerbation of illness or admission to higher levels of care.
Harvest	Outreach Team Lead	402.475.5161 x337	Community support for adults 55 and over who are experiencing problems with mental illness, substance use, or co-occurring disorders. Provided in collaboration with Aging Partners.
Recovery Support	Outreach Team Lead	402.475.5161 x337	Case management and crisis/relapse prevention for adults experiencing mental illness, substance use, or co-occurring disorders and who need minimal professional contact to reside independently in the community.
SOAR	Outreach Team Lead	402.475.5161 x337	SSI/SSDI Outreach Access and Recovery (SOAR) provides technical assistance and support with disability benefit and other mainstream resource applications for individuals who are experiencing homelessness and have a serious mental illness.
Street Outreach	Outreach Team Lead	402.475.5161 x337	Community outreach and engagement with people experiencing homelessness as well as mental illness, substance use or co-occurring disorders.
